The Town of Lake Santeetlah (TOLS) is moving forward in completing a Zoning Ordinance. To that end the Town Council has formed the Planning Board of Adjustment. Board members include Bill Campbell, Anne Hager, Craig Keith, Bill Piel and OH Yarberry.

A Town Comprehensive Plan must be developed prior to finalizing an Ordinance. This is in keeping with NCGS 160A-383 (d) which states, "Zoning regulations shall be designed to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare. To that end, the regulations may address, among other things, the following public purposes; to provide adequate light and air; to prevent the overcrowding of land; to avoid undue concentration of population; to lessen congestion in the streets; to secure safety from fire, panic and dangers; and to facilitate the efficient and adequate provision of transportation, water, sewerage, schools, parks, and other public requirements. The regulations shall be made with reasonable consideration, among other things, as to the character of the district and its peculiar suitability for particular uses, and with a view to conserving the value of buildings, and encouraging the most appropriate use of land throughout such city."

In general, a Comprehensive Plan is a written document that identifies the goals, objectives, principles, policies and standards for the protection, enhancement, growth and development of a town. It requires public participation in order to accurately reflect property owners' opinions on a variety of planning and growth issues. The Town's current Comprehensive Plan is its current Zoning Ordinance.
